The panels made it clear that indigenous communities both play immensely important and unrecognized roles in the fight against climate change both locally and globally. It is important to remember that as this fight progresses, indigenous communities are still threatened by systemic injustices including hate crimes and land dispossession. The conversation gave particular mention to the current threats against indigenous communities in Brazil. As they fight to protect the Amazonian rain forests, far-right President Jair Bolsonaro is rolling back protections for indigenous lands and committing explicit acts of violence against

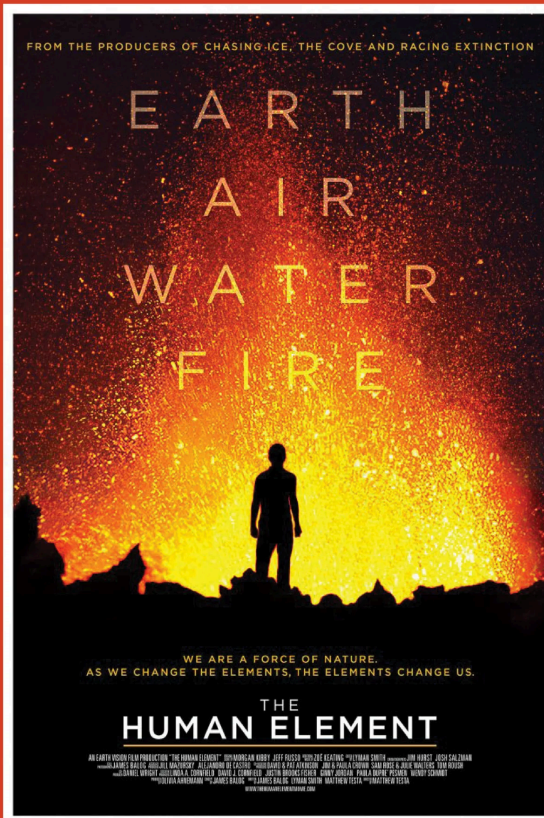
