Research: We work with

 into three general categories:
 Environmental and Climate
 Justice; Zero Waste and the
 Circular Economy; and Food.

2017-2018 research projects include:

- Hosting a Zero Waste Conference in Spring 2018,
- Conducting research on state level climate mitigation strategies with external environmental justice scholars,
- Research and partnership around the dearth of climate justice analytics.
- Curriculum: We are engaged in a multi-year effort to institute university-wide sustainability learning outcomes at The New School. Following a mandate from the Board of Trustees, all New School students will have these outcomes embedded into their program of study.

The events of the past weeks have illustrated the painful and ugly truth that racism and white supremacy have not yet been eradicated in this country.
