The Tishman Environment and Design Center integrates bold design, policy and social justice approaches to tackle the climate crisis and advance environmental justice.


Vision:

WASTE












The New School generates around **two and a half million pounds of waste each year.** Forty-five percent of that waste is directly diverted from a landfill through recycling and composting. **Our generation of waste contributes an additional 5 percent to the total carbon emissions generated by the campus.**


- Starting in the fall semester of 2023, we will redesign the waste management signs



FY2018 ENERGY CONSUMPTION





SUSTAINABLE CITIES CLUB




