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Sign the Statement of Support for the Standing Rock Sioux from The New School Faculty

Jaskiran Dhillon, Assistant Professor
of Global Studies and Anthropology,
invites New School faculty to sign a

statement of support for the Standing Rock Sioux, who are currently in resistance to the construction of the Dakota Access Pipeline, a project of the Dallas-based Energy Transfer Partners. According to Professor Dhillon, "in many ways, this is a monumental fight that very much represents our current social and political moment. But it also signals the deeply problematic terrain of settler colonialism that continues to be ever present in the lives of Indigenous Nations and their communities -- and this includes high incidences of violence against Indigenous women and girls that are linked to extractive projects. "Dhillon has been working alongside Indigenous communities in Canada for almost two decades. Standing Rock is directly south of where she grew up on Treaty Six Cree/Métis territory in Saskatchewan. Dhillon spent the better part of a week on Standing Rock this month, where there are unprecedented numbers of tribal nations coming out in support, as well as other allies standing in solidarity from across many movements (including a strong presence from Black Lives Matter). Dhillon observed, "They have set up camp and are holding the line against the massive fossil fuel project that will directly threaten the water source for so many people.

Elders, children, youth, families,
singers, dancers, artists, AIM
fighters, lawyers, writers, and
everyday people are peacefully
defending the land and
water."Construction on the pipeline
has been temporarily halted pending
a US federal court decision that is
expected to come down on
