Lack of Data on QTBIPOC Farmers

Some (limited) data on BIPOC farmers

Over the last century, 98% of Black farmers we dispossessed of their lands

Some data on LGBT farmers

97% of US farms are “family owned”

They function to reproduce heteronormativity, and exclude queer modes of relationality with each other and the land

Some data on QTBIPOC health

Roughly
3 in 10 LGBTQ people of color
4 in 10 transgender people of color
1 in 10 cisgender straight people
live in poverty
